## **August President's Message**

Friends,

I have sometimes been accused of being a pessimist. Other people think that I'm an optimist. Sometimes I've been called both simultaneously. This past month would push me more towards being an optimist. We've had a number of events that came off very well.

First there was our Jewish-Muslim interfaith event, in which we observed the Fast of the 17<sup>th</sup> of Tammuz simultaneously with one of the days of Ramadan. The 2 AM breakfast at Temple Beth Am was very well attended, mostly by Muslims but with a respectable Jewish attendance too. We had a delicious meal with a very informal discussion. All of the attendees were pleased. Special thanks go to Steve Teitel who did most of the cooking.

Steve also set up and cooked the kosher dinner items for the evening program, which was held at the Turkish Cultural Center. There was a good attendance by both Muslims and Jews in the evening. The Jewish perspective on fasting was presented by Rabbi Stein from Temple B'rith Kodesh. His talk was very informative. The Muslim viewpoint was presented by Ahmed Celenli, the Muslim chaplain at the U of R. There was a lively discussion afterwards. After the discussion we broke our fasts together.

Three weeks after the 17<sup>th</sup> of Tammuz comes the solemn day of Tisha B'Av. This year our observance was held at BHBI with participation by Temple Beth Am and Temple Beth David. There was active participation from all three shuls, with special thanks to Aaron Marsh from Beth Am and Rabbi Smookler from Beth David. Aaron led the Shabbat mincha service and did most of the Torah reading, the Rabbi led the evening service and provided an introduction to each chapter of Lamentations. In between the two services, I led a discussion of laws of mourning and how they interact with Shabbat. I hope everyone got as much out of the program as I did.

The other "event" that pleasantly surprised me, is the adoption of a new Mahzor for the High Holy Days. The Conservative movement has published Mahzor Lev Shalem. It has a more modern translation than we are used to, along with commentaries. Our Board has considered this book for several months and decided to adopt it. Several generous donors made this possible. I want to thank them for their generosity. We have enough books ordered so that we will be able to use the books this year. I want to reassure anyone who doesn't want to give up the Silverman Mahzor that there will be copies available as well.

During the month of August, we should be examining ourselves and preparing spiritually for the High Holy Days. In our congregational life, the main event will be the annual picnic, scheduled for the 23<sup>rd</sup> at BHBI. I look forward to seeing you there.
