February President's Message

Friends,

It has been a cold and snowy January. The big snowstorm of a week or so back caused the postponement of our Tu b'Shevat seder by a day, and hampered attendance. Nevertheless, for those who came, it was an enjoyable and fruity occasion! Thanks to Leon Metlay and Aaron Marsh of Beth Am for organizing the seder.

As for me, I was happily away visiting family in sunny Santa Cruz, California, strolling by the ocean and eating tacos. But on my return trip back to Rochester, I got to experience first-hand one of the deep teachings of Judaism – if you don't get what you want, then maybe it is because it would not really have been good for you, and G-d has some other plan in mind. My wife and I flew out to Santa Cruz on the Thursday before the big snowstorm, parking our car in the outdoor long-term parking lot at the Rochester airport. I was to return by myself (my wife returning later) the following Tuesday. Seeing pictures online of how Rochester looked after the big snowfall, I was apprehensive how I was ever going to dig my car out of the snow banks and drive home after the long and exhausting flight. My flight back from Santa Cruz stopped at O'Hare Airport, where I had to change planes to continue on to Rochester. Upon arriving at O'Hare, I learned that an ice storm in Chicago had caused the cancellation of my Rochester connection, as well as of all other flights to Rochester that day. I would have to wait until the next day to continue home. I was not happy. I had already woken up at 4:00 am in the morning to make the trip from Santa Cruz to the San Jose Airport for my early morning flight, and now I would have to wait another whole day before being able to crawl into my own bed in Rochester. Why was fate so mean to me? With nothing else to do I booked a room at the pleasant Candlewood Suites hotel near O'Hare (they are not paying me much to put in this plug), spent the night, and after another two hour departure delay, continued on to Rochester, arriving early evening on Wednesday. But the dark cloud has a silver lining. During the day on Wednesday the temperature in Rochester got above freezing, all the snow on my car had melted away, and with only some minor, but much appreciated, shoveling help from the airport shuttle driver, my car was freed and there were no problems driving home.

This year is a leap year in the Jewish calendar. We have a second month of Adar, and so Purim is coming "late" this year, in March. As such, there is not much special happening in February. But of course Shabbat is always special! So on a cold snowy or icy Saturday, what could be better than to enjoy the warmth (physical and spiritual!) of a BHBI Shabbat morning service, with the camaraderie and good food of our kiddush luncheon. I hope to see you there!

Adar I, Adar II. What Does an Extra Adar Mean for You?

This year is a leap year in the Jewish calendar, meaning that we add on an extra month of Adar (which we call Adar I). As a result, Purim and Passover are pushed back a month (Purim will be in late March and Passover in late April this year). The added leap month ensures that the Jewish holidays remain in their correct seasons.

BHBI WEBSITE



By the 1940s and 1950s, the tight-knit family is slowly unraveling, as each new generation embraces an American way of life, including moving to the suburbs instead of remaining with the extended family.
- **Broadway Danny Rose** – Sunday, February 17th at 4 pm; In a film that exults in the tradition of Jewish storytelling, Woody Allen added an extra air of authenticity by casting several revered comics, his own manager, and the owner of the Carnegie Deli as themselves.
