

#### April's Vice President's Message

Friends,

In the February Bulletin, Steve discussed a bit about the complexity of the Jewish Calendar, the necessity to keep track of both the Sun and the Moon in order to keep our holy days occurring in the correct seasons. Studying the heavens is a laudable activity. There have been famous Jewish astronomers and there are even three craters on the moon named after Rabbis. We are now preparing for a solar eclipse on April 8th.

In Genesis 1:14 it says: G-d said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the sky to separate day from night; they shall serve as signs for the set times—the days and the years." The words "serve as signs" could mean "to be omens." Rashi, the great medieval commentator says of this verse: "When the heavenly luminaries are eclipsed it is a sign of ill-omen for the world …"

He derives this opinion from the Talmud (Sukkah 29a): "The Sages taught: When the sun is eclipsed it is a bad omen for the entire world. A parable: To what is this matter comparable? To a king of flesh and blood who prepared a feast for his servants and placed a lantern before them to illuminate the hall. He became angry at them and said to his servant: Take the lantern from before them and seat them in darkness. ...The Sages taught: When the sun is eclipsed, it is a bad omen for the other nations. When the moon is eclipsed, it is a bad omen for ... the Jewish people, due to the fact that the Jewish people calculate their calendar based on the moon, and the other nations calculate based on the sun... When the sun is eclipsed in the east, it is a bad omen for the residents of the lands of the east. When it is eclipsed in the west, it is a bad omen for the residents of the lands of the west. When it is eclipsed in the middle of the sky, it is a bad omen for the entire world.

So, we come back to the calendar. A solar eclipse, in fact, always falls near Rosh Chodesh, because the time of the new moon is the only time the moon is directly between the earth and the sun.

Eclipses are natural events. Why would a natural and predictable event be considered an omen? The Maharal of Prague put it this way: light stands for order and darkness stands for chaos. God knew that people would often choose chaos over order. Eclipses remind us that our choices can create darkness, even when there should be light. We have to choose to seek the light.

Jeremiah (10:2) says: "Do not learn to go the way of the nations, And do not be dismayed by portents in the sky; Let the nations be dismayed by them!" If we follow God's will, we need not fear.

The Lubavitcher Rebbe said that eclipses are meant to be opportunities for increasing in prayer and introspection. They are not a joyous occasion and there is no special blessing for seeing an eclipse.

Of course, if you go out to see the eclipse (even if it's cloudy) be sure to wear proper eye protection.

#### Sale of Hametz – Passover 2024

Note: If possible, all hametz - food not acceptable during Pesah (Passover), or materials containing such unacceptable food should be destroyed or given away before the holiday begins. Should this be impossible, the hametz may be stored in such a way that we are sure not to use it during the holiday and its actual ownership is transferred to a non-Jew until the holiday ends.

Please complete the form below and return to Congregation BHBI, 1369 East Ave, Rochester, NY 14610 to be <u>in the office</u> no later than Monday, April 15, 2024. Note: All forms MUST be signed and indicate the address of the hametz to be sold, or they will not be valid. You may also email a signed and scanned copy of this form to BHBIRochester@gmail.org. All emailed forms must be received by 5pm, April 15, 2024. You must wait until 9:35pm on the last day of Pesach (April 30) before using any of your previously sold hametz, so as to allow Rabbi Marsh sufficient time to buy it back for you.

KNOW ALL PEOPLE BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, the undersigned do here by make and appoint Rabbi Aaron Marsh my true and lawful representative to act in my place and stead, for me and in my name and in my behalf, to sell all *hametz* owned and possessed by me, knowingly or unknowingly, as stated in the Torah and defined by the sages of Israel (e.g., *hametz; hashash hametz*—suspect *hametz;* and all kinds of *ta'arovet hametz*—hametz mixtures); also, *hametz* that tends to harden and to adhere to the surface of pans, pots, or other cooking or eating utensils, of whatsoever nature, and to lease all places wherein the aforementioned *hametz* owned or possessed by me may be found, especially in the premises located at

Rabbi Aaron Marsh has the full authority and power to sell said <i>hametz</i> and to lease said place or
places where in said <i>hametz</i> may be found, upon terms and conditions as discretion dictates.
Rabbi Aaron Marsh has the full power and authority to assign or appoint a substitute or
substitutes to act in my behalf with all the same powers and authority that I have invested in
Rabbi Aaron Marsh, and I do hereby ratify and confirm all that Rabbi Aaron Marsh or a rabbinic
substitute lawfully does or causes to be done by virtue of these presents. And to this I hereby
