Recipe for Parve Cowboy Kugel, as served at "Barbecue and Borocho"

Ingredients: 8 oz wide noodles, 3 eggs separated, 2 Tbs margarine, 1/2 tsp cinnamon, 1/2 tsp vanilla extract, 1/2 cup sugar, raisins or apples as desired

Boil noodles, leave slightly underdone; add margarine to noodles and mix; mix cinnamon into sugar; add cinnamon sugar mixture to noodles; add egg yolks; add vanilla extract; add raisins or apples; mix noodle mixture and pour into greased baking tray; beat egg whites until stiff, then fold into noodles. Bake at 350 F for 30 to 40 minutes until done.
