April President's Message

Friends,

As I write this, I am in the middle of preparations for Passover, which starts tomorrow night. But as you read this, you have probably already had your seders! I hope you have had a happy, healthy, and kosher holiday, shared with friends and family. See the calendar in this Bulletin for the schedule of holiday services.

Later this month, on Saturday, April 20, we will have the next in our Simon Finkelman Memorial Lectures series. This year we are very pleased to have visiting us Simon's own son, Prof. Paul Finkelman, the President William McKinley Distinguished Professor of Law at Albany Law School. Prof. Finkelman is a scholar of American legal history and constitutional law, who is an expert on topics related to freedom of religion, the law of slavery, civil liberties and the American Civil War, and legal issues surrounding baseball. His articles have appeared in scholarly journals as well as in the *New York Times*, the *Washington Post*, *USA Today*, and on the *Huffington Post* web site. Prof. Finkelman's lecture is entitled, "Are the Ten Commandments the Moral Foundation of American Law? Why Jews Should be Concerned About Public Displays of the Decalogue," and will take place at 1:30 pm, following kiddush after Shabbat morning services. A dessert reception will follow the lecture, which is open to the public. So be sure to come, and bring a friend!

On May 5th, the first Sunday in May, BHBI is pleased to be initiating a new Jewish-Muslim interfaith dialogue series. The series is co-sponsored by the Small Conservative Shul Collaborative (BHBI, Temple Beth Am and Temple Beth David) and the Turkish Cultural Center of Rochester (TCC). Each event in the series will focus around a particular topic of mutual interest to our two communities. A brief presentation on the topic will be made, and then the audience will have the opportunity to ask questions of a panel of representatives. Following the discussion, refreshments will be served and there will be opportunity to socialize and get to know each other. You may recall our previous encounters with the TCC, when we were invited to a Ramadan break-fast dinner last August, and when they joined us for our Sukkot dinner last October. All who participated felt a great sense of friendship and common bonds. We hope this series will enable these bonds to grow, while providing an opportunity for each community to learn more about the religious beliefs and cultural practices of the other. The first meeting will be at BHBI, tentatively at 10 am. Please check your May Bulletin for the topic of the discussion and to confirm the time. The dialogue series is open to the general public, and all are welcome!

He has written extensively on Thomas Jefferson and on Abraham Lincoln. Professor Finkelman was the chief expert witness in the Alabama Ten Commandments monument case and his scholarship on religious monuments in public spaces was cited by the U.S. Supreme Court in *Van Orden v. Perry* (2005).
