January President's Message

Friends,

It was good to see so many of you at the Chanukah party. I had a great time (I won the dreidel game this year!) Steve Teitel did a wonderful job, ably assisted by Janet Grable (fantastic cakes!), Judith Mercer, Paula Bobb, Sylvia Rose, Esther Vogelstein, Ami Schmerl and me. Thank you so much.

One thing we've done in past years but not this year, was to have a trivia contest. A few years ago one of the questions was "Who was the first woman rabbi?" If I remember correctly, Rabbi Goldberg was in attendance and had the correct answer: Regina Jonas, ordained December 25, 1935, in Germany. The other day I was reading in the Encyclopedia Judaica and I came upon an entry the sheds doubt on that answer. How many of you have ever heard of Asenath Barzani? The little bit I've been able to learn about her suggests that she was functioning as the head of a yeshiva about 350 years ago. That just blew me away. I spend my life surrounded by Jewish feminists. How could I not have heard of her?

Asenath Barzani lived in Mosul, in Kurdistan (northern Iraq). She was born about 1590. Her father, Shmuel Barzani, was one of the chief scholars of the Kurdish Jewish community. He established yeshivas and he taught what he knew to his daughter. This included Jewish texts and even Kabbalah. Her father didn't make her do domestic work, only learn Torah. She married one of her father's chief disciples, her cousin, Rabbi Jacob Mizrahi. She wrote that part of the marriage agreement was that she would continue to study, though sources differ on whether or not that was actually written in her ketubah. Her husband took over her father's yeshiva. He was a great scholar but was not very worldly. While he continued his studies, she ran his yeshiva. She continued as Rosh Yeshiva after his early death. She appears to have corresponded with scholars all around the region and to have been addressed by them as the Tanna'it, literally the female Tanna, a Talmudic scholar. She taught many subjects, she wrote Hebrew poetry, and there are even stories that she performed miracles. She lived in poverty all her life, but she accomplished so much. I need to learn more about her. At the last Interfaith Dialogue program on the discussion of roles of women in religion, Melissa Nunes-Harwitt discussed some of the ways that modern Orthodox Judaism is exploring the roles of women just as Reform and Conservative Judaism are doing. I think we could all learn something from Tanna'it Asenath Barzani.

Speaking of interfaith dialogue, our next joint program with the Turkish Cultural Center will be on Sunday, January 25th from 2-4 PM at the Turkish Cultural Center, 2692 Dewey Avenue. We will be talking about our social relationships with Christians. A similar program last year was very well received and the subject can be explored much further. I hope to see you there.
