June President's Message

Friends,

Well, you've done it again. We had our Annual Congregational Meeting, attended by a quorum of our membership, and you elected the "usual suspects" to lead you again for the next year. The Board, officers, and I will endeavor to live up to your trust.

It was good seeing so many of you at our Shavuot programs, shared this year with Temple Beth Am and Temple Beth David. There are some people who I didn't see at either the Annual Meeting or at Shavuot services. I haven't heard about anyone being ill, but if you know of anyone in the congregation who is ill please let the Synagogue office know about it, you can call the office and leave a message on the machine.

We are coming up to the last of our currently planned Jewish- Muslim Dialogue programs. It will be on Sunday, July 5^{th} . I'm telling you about it now because there won't be much time for you to read about it in the July Bulletin, and I'd like you to have time to think about it.

The topic will be fasting. Every year Muslims observe a month of fasting, Ramadan. Each day they fast from dawnto-dark, they can eat and drink at night but not during the day. Jews observe the strict 25 hour fasts of Tisha B'Av and Yom Kippur, but in addition we have a number of minor fast days that are only observed during the day. One of these days is the 17th of Tammuz. It occurs 3 weeks before Tisha B'Av and remembers events linked to the destruction of the First Temple by the Babylonians and of the Second Temple by the Romans. This year the Fast of the 17th of Tammuz is observed on July 5th. Ramadan is observed from June 18th to July 17th, so for that one day Jews and Muslims will be fasting together during daylight hours.

Plans are still evolving, so I can't give you full details. As they stand, there will be two programs. One will be a breakfast, held in the wee small hours of the morning, before dawn. The other will be a dinner held after dark. I don't know who the speakers will be or what other activities will happen, but I'm sure it will be fun and informative. The programs will be held at the Turkish Cultural Center (TCC) of Rochester on Dewey Avenue. The TCC will have food which is halal but not kosher. For any of us who want kosher food, kosher meals will be prepared in our synagogue kitchen and transported to the TCC. I think it will be a bit of an adventure and I'm looking forward to it. I hope to see you there.

In the mean time, enjoy the month of June.
