July President's Message

Friends,

This is a time of contrasts. In the secular calendar, we are entering the high point of the summer. Warmth. Sun. Fireworks. Picnics. In the Jewish calendar we are about to enter the three weeks of mourning, from the Fast of the 17th of Tammuz, which we will be observing jointly with Temple Beth Am, Temple Beth David, and the Turkish Cultural Center on July 5th (get your reservations in) to the Fast of the 9th of Av, which we will be observing with Temple Beth Am and Temple Beth David on the evening of July 25th. These fast days are associated with the destruction of the two Temples in Jerusalem, by the Babylonians in 586 BCE and by the Romans in 70 CE.

The rabbis teach us that the destruction of the second Temple was brought about because of causeless hatred. If you look around at our country and the world right now, you might even wonder if there is something else getting ready to be destroyed. Last week's two momentous Supreme Court decisions, upholding the Affordable Care Act and upholding same-sex marriage were greeted by very partisan reactions, great celebration and great vitriol. I would qualify the vitriolic reactions as causeless hatred, hatred out of proportion to the issues. I see a lot of it in the media and in the social media, including coming from people I know.

As far as I know, Conservative Judaism does not have an opinion about the Affordable Care Act, but it does have an opinion about same-sex marriage. In fact, it has two. In 2006 an opinion was published supporting same-sex marriage. At the same time, another opinion was published which did not support same-sex marriage. It is left to the individual rabbi to decide which opinion to accept. The result has been that the Conservative seminaries are now accepting homosexual students and in 2012 the Rabbinic Assembly published a Jewish ritual for performing a same-sex marriage. The argument in favor of same-sex marriage is that rabbinic restrictions in halacha can be overturned in support of human dignity. Human dignity is an argument that also was used in the Supreme Court decision.

As you proceed into the summer and the upcoming election season, as you look at events in Europe, in the Middle East, and elsewhere, feel free to hold as strong opinions as you want to, but express them in a way that upholds your own dignity and the dignity of those you oppose. Don't increase the expression of hatred.

Enjoy your summer.

Fasting in Our Religious Traditions

Marking the coincidence of the Jewish partial fast day of the 17th of Tammuz with the Muslim fasting month of Ramadan, BHBI, Temple Beth Am, Temple Beth David, the Turkish Cultural Center of Rochester and the Peace Islands Institute of Upstate NY will have a joint program on "Fasting in our Religious Traditions" as part of our ongoing 'United by Faith' Interfaith Series. Joint activities will include a pre-fast meal before sunrise on Sunday, July 5th, a discussion of the Jewish and Muslim perspectives on fasting on Sunday evening and a post-fast dinner.

The pre-fast meal will start at 2:25 a.m., hosted by Temple Beth Am at their Temple B'rith Kodesh location. The meal will conclude at 2:58am (to accommodate start of the Ramadan fast; the Jewish fast starts at 3:40am).

The post-fast dinner will start at 9:31 p.m. and will be hosted by the Turkish Cultural Center at their building (the Ramadan fast ends 9:01pm, the Jewish fast ends 9:31pm).

Prior to the dinner there will be program led by Rabbi Peter Stein of Temple B'rith Kodesh and by Dr. Ahmed Celenli, the U of R Muslim chaplain, on the meaning of fasting in our different religious traditions. The program will begin at 8:15pm and is at the Turkish Cultural Center, 2692 Dewey Ave.

Turkish food will be halal but not kosher. Kosher meals will be available for those who request it. Reservations are required for each meal (but not the program). To make a reservation, please send an email to bhbirochester@gmail.com, and indicate which meal(s) you are making a reservation for, and whether you wish to have a kosher meal. Reservations are due by 5 p.m. on Friday, July 3rd.

The Significance of the 17th of Tammuz and Tisha b'Av

July marks two fast days, the 17th of Tammuz and the 9th (Tisha) of Av. Both dates are very significant in the Jewish calendar. The 17th of Tammuz marks the date on which the Romans breeched the walls of Jerusalem, while the 9th of Av marks the date on which several terrible events happened in Jewish history including the date on which both the First and Second Temples were destroyed, the date on which Beitar, the last Jewish fortress to fall to the Romans during the Bar Kochba Rebellion was captured, marking the beginning of a tremendous loss of life, and the date on which the Jews were expelled from Spain during the Inquisition. The 17th of Tammuz is commemorated as a fast during daylight hours only while Tisha b'Av is observed as a complete fast day (like Yom Kippur). The Book of Lamentations is read and we sit on the floor or on low seats as in mourning during Tisha b' Av services. The 3 weeks from the 17th of Tammuz until the 9th of Av are days of mourning in which no weddings or other festivities are scheduled.
