

October President's Message

Friends,

I hope you enjoyed our High Holy Day services as much as I did (or even more). I really liked the new Mahzor, both the more modern translations and the commentaries. At the same time, I think we managed to keep the "haimish" atmosphere of our services the same as in the past. I want to thank our Board for approving the book and our generous donors who made the purchase possible. Of course, our Cantor, Dr. George Kornfeld, gets a lot of the credit for things going so smoothly. It can't be easy leading from a new book after a using the same one for 11 years.

On Yom Kippur I gave the obligatory President's Talk. I won't repeat it here except to remind you that my theme was "Hineni", "Here I am". That doesn't just mean "I'm standing on this particular spot" but rather "I am here and I am receptive to what you're going to tell me." We should answer "Hineni" when G-d calls us to serve in whatever capacity we can, and in return (at least according to Isaiah) G-d will answer "Hineni" when we call.

As I write this the second day of Sukkot has just passed. We had a group of dedicated volunteers put up the sukkah again this year. I had a discussion with our past President, Mark Bobb, who built the sukkah. We figured out that this is the 13th year that this sukkah was used. We hosted joint services with Beth Am and Beth David on the first night, which were well attended. The rest of the services so far have been at the other two shuls, and our people have been well represented at all of them.

Next week, Beth Am is having a potluck vegetarian dinner in their sukkah at 6 PM on Sunday, October 4th. You don't need reservations, just bring a dairy or pareve dish to pass. The dinner will be followed by an evening Shemini Atzeret service with yizkor. The following morning, the service for Shemini Atzeret, with yizkor, will be at our shul. Kiddush is being prepared by Janet Grable, so you know it will be fantastic. Janet will also be preparing the goodies for the evening service for Simchat Torah and the Simchat Torah morning service, which will also both be at our shul. Come and join the fun. Sukkot and Shemini Aatzeret are called "z'man simchateinu" meaning "the time of our rejoicing." Come rejoice with us.

This year's Jewish Book Festival will be held from November 8 - 22. There will be a number of presentations by authors:

- Sunday, November 8th at 10 a.m. at the JCC, Jane Yolem will discuss *The Devil's Arithmetic*, her Holocaust themed book for young readers
- Sunday, November 8th at 7 p.m. at the JCC, will feature former Tel Aviv bureau chief for NBC News, Martin Fletcher, who will discuss his novel, *The War Reporter*. A dessert reception will follow.
- Tuesday, November 10th at 7 p.m. at the JCC, Allena Rieger will discuss her book *I Didn't Tell Them Anything* in which she describes uncovering the missing pieces in her parents lives including their flight from Poland, forced labor in Siberia, refuge in Kazakhstan and long journey to America.
- Wednesday, November 11th at 7 p.m., Steve Katz will give his personal account of the rock 'n' roll world and his book *Blood, Sweat and My Rock 'n' Roll Years* along with a performance at the Irondequoit Country Club. An open bar will be available starting at 6 p.m.
- Thursday, November 12th at 7 p.m. at the JCC, Nomi Eve will discuss her novel *Henna House* which interweaves the traditions of Yemenite Jewry with their flight to Israel.
- Sunday, November 15th at 10 a.m. at the JCC, Susan Dworski Nusbaum will present her book of poetry *What We Take With Us.*
- Sunday, November 15th at 11:15 a.m. at the JCC, Todd Moss discusses his novel *Minute Zero*, the latest book his *Judd Ryker* thriller series.
- Sunday, November 15th at 7 p.m. at the JCC, Rabbi Simon Jacobson discusses his book *Toward a Meaningful Life* which makes the teachings of Judaism timely and relevant.
- Monday, November 16th at 7 p.m. at the JCC, Dani Klein Modisett brings a humorous approach to marriage when discussing his book *Take My Spouse, Please: How to Keep Your Marriage Happy, Healthy, and Thriving by Following the Rules of Comedy.* A wine bar will be available before the presentation.
- Friday, November 20th at noon at the JCC, there will be a fiction panel luncheon with Jessamyn Hope, the author of *Safekeeping*, and Sigal Samuel, the author of *The Mystics of Mile End*. Ice cream will be provided.
