November President's Message

Friends,

October is going out in a gust of wind and rain. November is coming with no special Jewish observances until Chanukah comes in December. There will be Chanukah programs at Temple Beth Am on December 6th and at BHBI on December 13th. More information will be coming in the December bulletin.

The Jewish month we are in right now is Marcheshvan. The Hebrew name of the month, in the days before the Babylonian exile was Bul, and some commentators suggest that the flood of Noah “mabul” came during this month. After the Babylonian exile we continued to use the Babylonian names for months and most of the original Hebrew names were lost. Marcheshvan is derived from the Akkadian word warach-samnu which literally means “eighth month”. The word samnu is related to the Hebrew shmoneh, which means eight. At some point people started calling the month just Cheshvan. There are a number of stories to explain the longer name Marcheshvan. The most common one is that “mar” in Hebrew means “bitter”, and Marcheshvan is “bitter Cheshvan”. What’s bitter about it? Cheshvan has no holidays and it is a let-down after the month of Tishrei which is packed with holidays. There are other stories about why Cheshvan might be bitter. Your homework assignment is to find them. I’ll give you a hint: someone named Amraphel is involved.

At the October Board meeting I extended an invitation to the Board members to contribute their own writings for the monthly bulletin President’s message. I am doing the same to all of you. If you have some thoughts related to the season that you would like to share, pass them along to me and I will include them as space allows. The only condition I impose, besides having adequate space, is that I will not publish political polemics and I will be the judge of what is political.

This year's Jewish Book Festival will be held from November 8 – 22. There will be a number of presentations by authors:

- Sunday, November 8th at 10 a.m. at the JCC, Jane Yolem will discuss *The Devil's Arithmetic*, her Holocaust themed book for young readers
- Sunday, November 8th at 7 p.m. at the JCC, will feature former Tel Aviv bureau chief for NBC News, Martin Fletcher, who will discuss his novel, *The War Reporter*. A dessert reception will follow.
- Tuesday, November 10th at 7 p.m. at the JCC, Allena Rieger will discuss her book *I Didn't Tell Them Anything* in which she describes uncovering the missing pieces in her parents' lives including their flight from Poland, forced labor in Siberia, refuge in Kazakhstan and long journey to America.
- Wednesday, November 11th at 7 p.m., Steve Katz will give his personal account of the rock 'n' roll world and his book *Blood, Sweat and My Rock 'n' Roll Years* along with a performance at the Irondequoit Country Club. An open bar will be available starting at 6 p.m.
- Thursday, November 12th at 7 p.m. at the JCC, Nomi Eve will discuss her novel *Henna House* which interweaves the traditions of Yemenite Jewry with their flight to Israel.
- Sunday, November 15th at 10 a.m. at the JCC, Susan Dworski Nusbaum will present her book of poetry *What We Take With Us*.
- Sunday, November 15th at 11:15 a.m. at the JCC, Todd Moss discusses his novel *Minute Zero*, the latest book his Judd Ryker thriller series.
- Sunday, November 15th at 7 p.m. at the JCC, Rabbi Simon Jacobson discusses his book *Toward a Meaningful Life* which makes the teachings of Judaism timely and relevant.
