May President's Message

Friends:

We had a wonderful series of services during Passover, in conjunction with Temple Beth Am and Temple Beth David. There was a good-sized crowd at every service and the Torah readings and service leading were distributed between the congregations. Those who attended had a good time. At the end of May we will be celebrating Shavuot, the giving of the Torah. We will again be sharing services. At the time of this writing, the schedule of services is not yet set.

We are now in the time between Passover and Shavuot, the period known as the Omer. This is a time period with its own set of laws and customs, which are not well known and of which the origins are not well known. The Torah says we should count seven complete weeks between Passover and Shavuot. There was a dispute about whether to start counting on the second day of Passover when the first omer (a measure) of the new barley was brought to the Temple, or to start counting on the Sabbath during Passover. The Rabbis decided to start on the second day, which is our custom now, though the Karaite sect starts counting on the Sabbath, so that their Shavuot is often later than ours. The period of the Omer is a time of modified mourning - no weddings, no haircuts, no music or dancing. Why do we mourn? The explanation in the Talmud is that the great Rabbi Akiva had 12,000 pairs of students who died in a plague during the Omer period. The reason for the plague is that they didn't respect each other. Some scholars say that this was a code in the Talmud for saying that the students were killed by the Romans during the Bar Kochba rebellion of 132-135 CE. We know that Rabbi Akiva was killed at that time (we read about his death in the Yom Kippur musaf service). Another reason that I've seen is that during and after the Crusades there were anti-Jewish pogroms during the Omer period.

The mourning ceases on the 33rd day of the Omer, Lag B'Omer (May 14th this year). The Talmud says that the plague among Akiva's students stopped on the 34th day. So why on the 33rd? That day is the yahrzeit of the great Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai, who lived in the 2rd century CE and is credited with writing the Zohar, the greatest of the Kabbalistic mystical books. He told his students to celebrate the day of his death, and to this day, thousands of Jews visit his grave in northern Israel on this date. It is customary to build bonfires and to play with bows and arrows. Why bows and arrows? Perhaps that is a connection to the Bar Kochba rebellion. It certainly doesn't seem to relate to either Rabbi Akiva or Shimon bar Yochai.

Another custom during the Omer is to study the Kabbalah, especially about how we should all try to treat each other better. That clearly connects both to the story about Akiva's students and to Shimon bar Yochai. So as we continue into the month of May we should all resolve to treat each other better.

One thing we can do for each other is to attend the Congregation's annual meeting on Sunday, May 7th at 3 pm. We need to have a quorum in order to conduct our business, elect our Board and Officers, and make decisions for the coming year. I hope to see you there.
