November President's Message

Friends,

Whew! Holidays over! We had a very nice and festive holiday season at BHBI, with shared services with our partners Temples Beth Am and Beth David, and a great dinner in the sukkah. Thanks to sukkah constructors Paula Bobb, Ira Cohen, Harris Honickman, Nina Klionsky, Leon Metlay, Stan Schaffer, Tammy Strubel, and Ken and Mollie Traub. And thanks to sukkah de-constructors Paula, Ira, Harris, Ken and Mollie. Thanks to Nina and Judith Mercer for helping me prepare the Sukkot dinner, and thanks to Harris, Nina, Leon and Sylvia Rose, and all others who helped set up and clean up. Now, on to Chanukah!

As you may have noticed, work has finally begun on our roof repairs. Just in time for the winter rain and snow! Thanks to Harris for interfacing with our contractor and supervising the repairs.

As we start again the cycle of Torah reading, it is interesting to ask what archeological evidences may exist for the various stories we find there. I was reading an interesting article in today's Haaretz (English edition) on just this topic (see https://www.haaretz.com/archaeology/.premium-1.818795, but you might need a subscription to read it). Among the claims in this article: Although the book of Genesis mentions camels (recall Rebecca fell off her camel upon first seeing Isaac!), the earliest domestic camel bones found in Israel date to around 930 B.C.E., about a millennia later. There is no archeological evidence for walls around Jericho at the date when Joshua supposedly brought them down. There is no archeological evidence clearly supporting an exodus from Egypt! Although we read that Abraham went to visit the land of the Philistines, the historical record does not have the Philistines arriving until centuries later, around 1200 B.C.E. (however old Rabbinic sources, going back at least as far as the Septuagint, do argue that the Philistines of Genesis were not the same people as the Philistines of Deuteronomy, so maybe there is an out here!). While most archeologists seem to agree on these points, the situation gets murkier as we move later on in our history. A point under active contention (by archeologists) concerns the question as to whether there ever was a large united kingdom under Kings David and Solomon, or if Jerusalem under David and Solomon was never more than a small backwater town. Until recently, the more cynical second view seemed to be the prevailing one, but more recent excavations are lending some support towards the Biblical narrative. Debate remains as to whether new excavations in the "City of David", south of the Temple Mount, have found any remnants of King David's palace, or not. Currently there seem to be two schools of thought vying against each other: the Biblically leaning school, centered with archeologists based in Jerusalem, and the "minimalist school" centered in Tel Aviv. Why do I not find that surprising? Anyway, an interesting article if you can get it.

Kristallnacht Program with Dr. Deborah Lipstadt

Renowned Holocaust historian, Dr. Deborah Lipstadt, Professor of Modern Jewish and Holocaust Studies at Emory University, will speak at the MCC Center for Holocaust Studies' Kristallnacht program on Wednesday evening, November 8th at 7:00 p.m. at the Warshof Conference Center in MCC Building 3. The author of several books on the Holocaust, she was also the subject of a libel suit by British Holocaust denier David Irving. She fought the suit in a British court, where there is a presumption of guilt and a person being sued for libel has to prove that they did not libel the accuser, and won, as was illustrated in the recent feature film 'Denial'.
