December Board Member's Message

Friends,

Over the last month we have observed the renovation of the roof on our building. Most of us have dealt with this maintenance activity for our own homes. We sometimes delay the work because of distractions or to delay incurring the expense. We are warned about the consequences of such procrastination by Kohelet (King Solomon) in Ecclesiastes.

"Through indolence the rafters sag, and through slackness the house leaks." (Ecclesiastes 10:18)

We certainly have suffered the consequences of our "indolence." By delaying work on our roof – even after evidence of water infiltration was visible – our roof rafters, interior walls and attic suffered further damage which we have paid for with increased cost over what it would have been if we had been more proactive. Perhaps this is why Ecclesiastes is read during Sukkot. That is after all the beginning of the rainy season in much of the world and it is when we begin to recite in the Amidah: "You cause the wind to blow and the rain to fall."

There are other kinds of leaks. People - like rain - can fall through the cracks. Even in these times of relative national prosperity, there are many who are in want. There may have been the impression that the Jewish community was largely insulated from this concern, but a survey conducted recently by Jewish Family Services and Jewish Senior Life highlighted the problem of poverty and food insecurity among Jews in the Rochester area. The visibility of the problem may have been muted because many in need are reluctant to reveal their predicament and are embarrassed to approach agencies and ask for help. As much as 30 percent of the people who use the Brighton Food Cupboard are Jewish. The Jewish Federation's Super Sunday fundraiser will be conducted in February. Many of the funds collected are devoted to agencies like Jewish Family Service. When the time comes, please consider a generous contribution for those among us to receive help in a dignified way. Also consider contributions to agencies like the United Way which support the larger community in the area.

Chanukah begins on the evening of December 12. We are planning a party for Sunday December 17th which will begin at 5:00 p.m. Contact the office by email with your reservation. We'll have latkes, dreidels, music and fun. Bring your children, family and friends.
