May President's Message

Friends,

Our Jewish-Muslim interfaith event last month was a nice success. About 40 people came out to listen to our speakers: Dr. Ahmet Celenli described some of the positive history and more recent less-happy developments in Turkey concerning the interaction of the government with ethnic/religious minorities; Sam Asher gave an animated portrait of his family's history and experiences in the Egypt of the early to middle 20th century; Dr. Bilal Ahmed discussed his family background in Pakistan and his recent discovery of genetically close relatives among Polish Jewry. We then enjoyed discussion and snacks in celebration of the end-of-Passover Mimouna holiday. Our sincere appreciation goes to the three speakers, as well as to our snack preparers: Paula Bobb, Judith Mercer, Sylvia Rose and Tammy Strubel.

As you may know, Rochester is fortunate to be hosting acclaimed Israeli author Amos Oz, who is here as the first Farash Foundation Fellow for the Advancement of Jewish Humanities and Culture. I attended his first talk, which was on April 24. It was truly wonderful. The talk centered on Oz's book from 2002, "A Tale of Love and Darkness," which was based upon his youth and family story in pre-independence Palestine (even if you have seen the movie, go read the book!). His talk painted a vivid portrait of what it was for his parents and family members, European intellectuals, to move to Palestine at that time; a social world that was lost and anxieties and hopes that were gained in the move. I noticed the talk being videotaped. If it becomes available online I urge you to watch and listen. This message gets to you too late for me to urge you to go hear Oz's second talk, which will be Monday April 30 at the University of Rochester; but I can still urge you attend the talk of his wife, Nily Oz, who will speak on "My Life on a Kibbutz" on Wednesday, May 9, at noon in Auditorium C of the JCC.

Please save the date, Wednesday, June 6, 7:00pm for a performance of The Hoffman-Lemish Quartet in Concert at the JCC Hart Theater. Coming from Toronto, the Quartet consists of keyboard, oud, double bass and percussion, and plays an engaging blend of jazz with Jewish folk melodies. Tickets are only \$15 and may be purchased in advance by calling the JCC Main Desk at 461-2000. Tickets are also available at the door. The concert is being sponsored as a collaboration of several area synagogues, specifically BHBI, Temples Beth Am, Beth David, Beth El, Emanu-El and B'rith Kodesh, in partnership with the Louis S.
