## March President's Message

Friends,

The Israeli national elections are now weeks away. Unlike the US, in Israel one does not directly vote for the Prime Minister, nor for any specific representative. Israel has a parliamentary system in which parties make lists of their candidates and voters vote for the list of their choice. If a party clears the required minimum of 3.25% of all votes, it then receives a number of seats in the Knesset proportional to its vote count. The party with the most seats tries to form a majority coalition and if successful, then selects the Prime Minister. Often different parties unite to present a single joint list as a means of strengthening their position. This past week was the deadline for parties to submit their lists for the election, and the result was a surprising number of new alignments, new fractures, and some significant departures from the political scene. To help you keep track, below is Steve's concise guide to the 2019 Israeli electoral lists! In the order in which they have ranked in recent polls, these are:

**Likud** is the mainstream center-right party headed by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. Netanyahu has been the longest serving Israeli PM, serving first in 1996-1999, then making a come back in 2009 and remaining in power ever since.

**Kachol-Lavan** (Blue-White) is the joint list of Hosen Yisrael (Israel Resilience) led by Benny Gantz, and Yesh Atid (There is a Future) led by Yair Lapid. Gantz, Chief of Staff of the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) from 2011-2015, is a political newcomer. The platform of his party remains vague. Lapid was a popular TV news anchor before entering politics in 2012. The centrist Yesh Atid was a coalition partner of Netanyahu's after the 2013 election but joined the opposition after 2015. Gantz and Netanyahu are thought to be the leading contenders to form the next government.

**HaYamin HeHadash** (New Right) is a new rightist party formed by the breakaway leaders of the Jewish Home party, Naftali Bennett and Ayelet Shaked. The Jewish Home party is a religious Zionist party that has advocated for annexation of large regions of the West Bank ("Area C"). The departure of Bennett and Shaked to form the New Right is an attempt to broaden the appeal of their platform beyond the religious sector.

**Labor** is the center-left party that ruled Israel from its founding until the aftermath of the Yom Kippur war, when it lost to Likud. In the 2015 election, Labor formed the Zionist Union together with the Hatnuah party of Tsipi Livni, who in previous Likud and Kadima led coalitions had served in several high ministerial positions. But in a surprise move this year, Labor's current leader Avi Gabbay announced that Labor was dissolving this partnership. Livni subsequently retired from politics.

**United Torah Judaism** is an alliance of Degel HaTorah and Agudat Yisrael, and represents the interests of the Ashkenazi Haredi sector. Because no party ever wins a majority in an election, United Torah Judaism has often played a key role in forming governing coalitions, and so exerted an influence exceeding its numbers.

**Hadash-Ta'al**: In an attempt to form a more powerful political block, in the 2015 elections four predominantly Arab parties united to form the Joint List, winding up tied with Yesh Atid as the 3rd largest faction in the current Knesset. However internal divisions have now caused the Joint List to split. The Hadash-Ta'al list includes Ta'al (Arab Movement for Change) headed by Ahmad Tibi, and Hadash (New), a descendent of the Communist Party, currently led by Ayman Odeh, the former leader of the Joint List.

**Ra'am-Balad** comprises the other two participants in the previous Joint List. Ra'am (United Arab List) receives support from religious and nationalist Israeli Arabs, and is popular among the Bedouin. Balad (Country) advocates for equal rights for Arab citizens and opposes the characterization of Israel as a Jewish state.

**Shas** is the Sephardi religious party. Founded in 1984, it has participated in both Likud and Labor led coalitions. In recent years it has been hurt by a rivalry between current leader Aryeh Deri, and Eli Yishai, who became leader when Deri was convicted of taking bribes and sent to prison in 2000. Following Deri's return to power, Yishai split to form his own party Yachad (Together) which will not be running in the current election.

**Meretz** (Vigor) is the leftist, social-democratic party, currently lead by Tamar Zandberg. Its prospects in the current election do not look good. It had sought an alliance to run on a joint list with Labor, but was rejected as being too leftist.

**Yisrael Beiteinu** (Israel our Home) is a right leaning party predominantly supported by Russian immigrants. Recently its support from that sector, and more generally, has declined. Its leader Avigdor Lieberman served as Defense Minister under Netanyahu until resigning late last year over the conduct of the war in Gaza.

Kulanu (All of Us) is a centrist party founded and led by Moshe Kahlon. It has focused on socioeconomic issues and is a member of the current governing coalition.

**HaBayit HaYehudi** (Jewish Home)-**National Union-Otzma Yehudit** (Jewish Strength): After the departure of its former leaders to form the New Right, HaBayit HaYehudi is led by Rafi Peretz, former Chief Rabbi of the IDF. The far-right National Union is led by MK Bezalel Smotrich, elected in 2015 on the Jewish Home list. The extreme-right Otzma Yehudit is led by Michael Ben-Ari, a follower of the late Rabbi Kahane. The merger of these parties occurred at the urging of PM Netanyahu, who promised two future cabinet positions to Jewish Home for agreeing to the deal.

**Gesher** (Bridge) is the party of Orli Levy-Abekasis who split from from Yisrael Beiteinu, and subsequently formed her own party in 2018. She is the daughter of the late David Levy, a prominent Likud politician of the 1980's.

Zehut (Identity) is a libertarian party founded in 2015 and led by former Deputy Speaker of the Knesset Moshe Feiglin.

Although many of these lists have names suggesting hope and unity, it would seem the Israeli political scene remains as divided and contentious as ever.
