

October President's Message

Friends,

As I write this, we are preparing for Rosh Hashanah services at the end of September after an enjoyable Slichot service held with Beth David and Beth Am. Dr. George Kornfeld will lead our High Holiday services through Yom Kippur.

Yom Kippur is the quintessential time for penitence. This is a time when we should desire to look to our leaders for examples of admirable personality, noble character and honesty. That those examples are largely absent from certain of our leaders should disappoint us but not cause us to despair. There were epochs in our history when a succession of leaders did that which "was evil in the eyes of the Lord." In the book of Kings not one of the kings of the northern Kingdom of Israel were cited as righteous and most of the kings of Judah were found wanting. It was G-d through the prophets and the Talmud who told us that "prayer, repentance and charity" can alter the consequence of following our worst impulses or those of our leaders.

As I mentioned in my letter that you received earlier this month, please try to come to services early, before 9:45 AM, on Yom Kippur morning so we can have a minyan when we reach the Borachu, and come early to Shabbat throughout the year. As Sukkot starts the week following Yom Kippur, please come Sunday morning, October 13, at 11:00 AM to help put up the sukkah. And don't forget to make your reservation for our Sukkot dinner that same day at 5:30 PM. Reservations by email or phone are due by Tuesday, October 8, at 5:00 PM. The schedule of services for Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah can be found below on page 2 of this Bulletin.

We also would like to improve attendance at our regular weekly Shabbat morning services, especially when someone has a yahrzeit. If you have an upcoming yahrzeit and plan to come to Shabbat services to say kaddish, please let me know so that we can notify members to make a special effort to attend and hopefully ensure a minyan. Helping to create a minyan so someone can say kaddish not only helps the family member involved, it is an excellent way to perform the very important mitzvah of showing kindness to the deceased.

In this time when we ask forgiveness for our sins from G-d and from each other, I ask your forgiveness for any slight I have caused you.
