

December President's Message

Friends,

There was a great summary of origins of Chanukah in last year's December Bulletin by our previous president, Steve Teitel. He discussed the multiple factors that prompted the Macabees to struggle against the Selucid Greeks which led to restoring the sanctity of the Temple. The Jews who had adopted Hellenistic culture joined with Antiochus IV to resist the traditional Jews led by Judah Maccabee. Steve also pointed out that latkes were originally made from cheese until the mid-19th century when potatoes were cultivated by the Russians. Who knew?

Chanukah literally means to rededicate. The contemporary emphasis has been on the fight for freedom – specifically religious freedom. Certainly the importance of freedom can't be denied, but why do the concepts of freedom, tolerance, justice, spirituality, devotion to righteous living, charity and reverence for G-d – all require a physical structure for their realization? Indeed some streams of Judaism reject the need for the Temple and disparage those Jews who fervently yearn for it to be rebuilt.

In our discussions we tend to emphasize the abstract over tactile substance. It is often considered more high-minded to speak of the "spirit" over the "material." Humans are however both material and spirit; one is not a substitute for the other. In our time the Temple – Beit HaMikdash – whether recalled as it once was or foreseen as will be in the future, can be both the spiritual and corporeal home for our prayer and ritual practice.

Beyond our rationalization for the need for the Temple, there is the Divine injunction to David through the prophet Nathan: "He shall build a house for me, and I will establish his throne forever." Chronicles 17: 12

The themes of Chanukah – liberation vs. oppression and Jewish Peoplehood vs. assimilation are driven by our prayer for the Temple to be rebuilt when we say "There we will serve thee with awe as in the days of old."

We observe Chanukah this year beginning the evening of December 22 until sundown on December 29. We will have a Chanukah party at the shul at 5:00 PM on Sunday December 22 with latkes, songs and games. Please make your reservation by 5 PM Tuesday, December 17. Leon Metlay has offered to chair the committee preparing the Chanukah meal. Please contact Leon to join in helping with preparations.


GOODSEARCH.ORG
