

September's President's Message

Friends,

September and High Holy Days. They are almost synonyms. I suppose in the modern era we could add the beginning of school to this mix. The September President's letter always includes mention of the date and times for services - and who will lead the services; for many years that has been Dr. George Kornfeld. This year will NOT be an exception.

We will hold services – OUTSIDE. Given the number of people we hope will attend and the need for social distancing, we will hold the services in the parking lot, south of the building. That area is somewhat quieter than all the other spots we have used for Shabbat services, as the building insulates it from East Avenue road noise. It can be sunny there, so we suggest you bring a wide brimmed hat and maybe – if you have one - a parasol, as well as a comfortable lawn chair. Folding chairs will also be available.

Everyone should wear masks, and keep a safe social distance. Regretfully, we ask that you not bring young children who can't be expected to observe these safe practices.

The services will be shorter than we usually have, with most piyutim (poetic readings) left out. We will also skip most English readings that we typically hand out. The shofar will be sounded from a safe distance.

The date and time for our Selichot service will be announced in early September. Rosh Hashanah begins on Friday evening, September 18th and continues through the 20th when we will also have Tashlich, jointly with Temple Beth Am and Ohel Avraham, at Lock 32 of the Erie Canal on Clover Street. Yom Kippur begins with Kol Nidre on the 27th and concludes on evening of the 28th. See page 4 of this Bulletin further details. We will notify everyone through email at least 3 hours before the start of services if we need to cancel due to rain.

This will be a different High Holy Day season, but in more than one way it will be just like it was in earlier years. We will be together. We will pray - for forgiveness, for health, for tolerance, for prosperity, for life and for peace.

As we were about to send this Bulletin, we just heard that a former long time member, Art Mercer has passed away. Baruch dayan ha'emet. May his memory be a blessing.
