December's President's Message

Friends,

The good news, that most of us are aware of, is that there are at least two vaccines which are about to become available and that are both effective and safe. There may be at least two more from several sources very soon. Further, the election has been decided and the ogres have begun to recede back into the shadows.

The conclusion of the election season is a time to rededicate ourselves to the ideals that elections are meant to attain – respect for our fellow citizens, for law and for truth; and for tolerance toward those with whom we disagree.

With the installation of a new administration, we will look with concern on how the nation's policy towards Israel and its neighbors may change. Whatever one thinks of the previous administration, there were favorable – though controversial – shifts in U.S. policy toward Israel. Some supporters of Israel thought the shifts were too favorable while others think they did not go far enough. The dialog to resolve the differences will test how well the election succeeded in achieving the mutual tolerance that a democracy requires.

Chanukah is a time for rededication now, just as it was 2200 years ago. We were successful for much of the time from the spring through the fall in conducting outside services behind our building. Now the weather has turned cold, and though we will try to have services when the unseasonably warm weather permits, it is likely that we won't be able to resume services until the weather turns warmer or a vaccine is released. Meanwhile we can participate with Beth Am's Shabbat Zoom services by logging on before Shabbat begins on Fridays. Look below in this Bulletin for the links and more details. We may be able to obtain special HEPA filters, which could allow limited services – indoors. We will keep the Congregation informed through email.


CEMETERY PLOTS
