

#### March's Vice President's Message

Friends,

"Now is the Winter of our discontent made glorious Summer..." (Shakespeare, Richard III). I've always wanted to use that quote. It has been almost a whole year of discontent for us. The last event we had unfettered by worry about COVID-19 was our Purim celebration. This year's celebration, as so many others, was limited to Zoom. It was a fun time, but it would have been more fun in person.

Our Winter of discontent is coming to an end. We have recommenced our regular Shabbat morning services and I would like to encourage you to attend. I realize that some of you are apprehensive about returning to in-person services and I would like to reassure you that we are doing everything possible to keep you safe. Of course this starts with continuing mask-wearing, hand sanitizer, and staying 6 feet apart. As you can see from the picture, we have set up chairs in clusters of two or three, so that couples can sit together. This is similar to the arrangement we made last summer for our outdoor services. Books are left at the chairs from week to week. Also, as we did in our outdoor services, we will only ever have one or two people on the bimah at a time.



As announced last January, thanks to the generosity of the Farash Foundation, we have purchased and set up six Winix HEPA air purifiers. In the photo these small black machines with the glowing blue lights are seen distributed throughout the room. There has been one recent scientific article in the journal "Aerosol Science and Technology" that found that putting machines similar to ours in a classroom caused a 90% decrease in aerosols. Finally, we are shortening the service. Our later start time of 10 AM reflects a reduction of the introductory service time from 45 to 15 minutes. The Torah service time has not changed. So, please come to our services, but do not come 30 minutes later than you used to! I'm looking forward to seeing you in shul.

### Sale of Hametz

Note: If possible, all hametz - food not acceptable during Pesah (Passover), or materials containing such unacceptable food - should be destroyed or given away before the holiday begins. Should this be impossible, the hametz may be stored in such a way that we are sure not to use it during the holiday and its actual ownership is transferred to a non-Jew until the holiday ends.

Please complete the form below and either mail to Temple Beth Am, 2131 Elmwood Ave., Room 103, Rochester, NY 14618, or email to <u>office@bethamrochester.org</u>, so as to be received in the Temple Beth Am office no later than 5 pm Monday, March 22, 2021. If you email, you must hand sign the form and send a scanned copy or readable photo. All forms will be then scanned and emailed by Temple Beth Am to Rabbi Marsh on Tuesday.

Note: Rabbi Marsh will execute the sale on Friday March 26, but the sale doesn't go into effect until late Shabbat morning, so people can keep a little chametz for Shabbat if they want, but it has to be completely eaten, disposed of, or put in with the other chametz sold by that time on Shabbat.

KNOW ALL PEOPLE BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, the undersigned do here by make and appoint Rabbi Aaron Marsh my true and lawful representative to act in my place and stead, for me and in my name and in my behalf, to sell all *hametz* owned and possessed by me, knowingly or unknowingly, as stated in the Torah and defined by the sages of Israel (e.g., *hametz; hashash hametz*—suspect *hametz;* and all kinds of *ta'arovet hametz*—hametz mixtures); also, *hametz* that tends to harden and to adhere to the surface of pans, pots, or other cooking or eating utensils, of whatsoever nature, and to lease all places wherein the aforementioned *hametz* owned or possessed by me may be found, especially in the premises located at:

Rabbi Aaron Marsh has the full authority and power to sell said *hametz* and to lease said place or places where in said *hametz* may be found, upon terms and conditions as discretion dictates. Rabbi Aaron Marsh has the full power and authority to assign or appoint a substitute or substitutes to act in my behalf with all the same powers and authority that I have invested in Rabbi Aaron Marsh, and I do hereby ratify and confirm all that Rabbi Aaron Marsh or a rabbinic substitute lawfully does or causes to be done by virtue of these presents. And to this I hereby affix my signature on this \_\_\_\_ day of March in the year 2021.
