November's President's Message

Friends,

This month I have a somewhat disjointed message which reflects my state of mind at present and things I am dealing with.

Last year I was rooting for Tampa Bay in the World Series against Los Angeles because I still hold a grudge against the Dodgers for leaving Brooklyn in 1957. This year, because my father was a long time Giants fan, I favored them against the wild card Dodgers even though the Giants also left New York the same year. Well the Dodgers beat the Giants in the division series, so I'm glad the Atlanta Braves beat the ex-Brooklynites for the pennant. In the World Series, I'm going with the Braves this year against Houston; they cheated less in recent years than the Astros. Yes, I know, the Giants' Barry Bonds was no paradigm of integrity for playing by the rules.

The hyper partisan events in our country, including the irrational opposition to vaccination, the racial strife, the anti-Zionism among some who call themselves Progressive, along with the disappointing conclusion of the war in Afghanistan gives one – well at least me – a sense that we are in a dystopian era. Some of the popular media series reflect this. Think of *The Walking Dead*, *The Hunger Games*, and the *Squid Game* (thanks to Steve Teitel for informing me about that last one).

However, the total cost for the repairs – not completed as yet – to our furnaces and gas lines will be considerable.

Chanukah arrives quite early this year, falling at the end of the Thanksgiving weekend on Sunday November 28. We should remember that the events surrounding the first Chanukah paralleled the dystopian circumstances in our present. There was a passionate devotion and defense of our faith in G-d and the Torah against external and internal attempts assimilate the practices of the Hellenistic culture. The miracle of Chanukah commemorates the victory that helped to preserve our faith. In succeeding years, even those streams of thought and philosophy that did not contradict Jewish practice, were sometimes viewed as controversial. The discussion about the perceived conflict between science and Jewish ethics continues to this day and still divides us.

We will communicate through email to the Congregation later in November what our plans are for celebrating Chanukah. Our plans will take account our concerns on how to limit exposure to COVID.

SHABBAT SERVICES




