Friends,

The expression "it's déjà vu all over again" is often attributed to Yogi Berra, but it is a sentiment that surely is felt by most of us at as we enter 2022. At this time last year we had come through a terrible 2020 year, having witnessed the death of almost 390,000 people. Earlier this year it appeared that we were over the hump and with vaccines were on the road to normalcy. Now, at the end of 2021, we are already over an additional 400,000 deaths, driven primarily by the reluctance on the part of many to be vaccinated. As a result, we must resume reduced social interactions, wear masks in all gatherings and for some, endure lockdowns and cancelled activities.

One of the most iconic moments in Jewish history, was when G-d, at Mt. Sinai, instructs the Israelites to "Choose life". That injunction has been unwittingly spurned by those who decide to remain unvaccinated. As has been well documented, the unvaccinated are living experiments in the development of new virus variants that may be more harmful than existing versions – and even worse – resistant to future vaccines and treatments.

However, a brief jaunt outside, exposed to the crisp morning air followed by a Shabbat service, may be all that you need to overcome your ennui. We often have a stimulating discussion about the Torah parsha, that can sustain your spirit through at least part of the weekend and even beyond.

So, please consider making a resolution to come to services more frequently.

We have heard that a former member, Moris Amon, is battling a serious illness. We extend our wishes for his healing.

In the coming secular year, I wish you all health and happiness.
