

#### May's President's Message

Friends,

April has started out as it typically does in Rochester – gray, cold and rainy with a few snow showers. Let's see if May follows like the song says it should ... with flowers. The COVID restrictions have largely been relaxed but we have to wonder if that is premature given the upsurge in new infections from new variants. Is wearing a mask really that onerous? I came to think of it as something of a fashion statement.

There are some things that I never thought I would live see. One was the collapse of the Soviet Union. In the late 1980s, I thought that it would just continue to go on for decades. Now we see the Russian Revolution has come full circle with the effective re-establishment of a Czarist regime with economic inequality in Russia more extreme than it was in the U.S. during the gilded age. The brutality of Putin's war on Ukraine has reached a level reminiscent of other mass killings in the 20th Century. Of course we've known of mass killings in Asia, Africa and Central America – and it is not acceptable to be more outraged about such atrocities in Europe than in those places, but I had put it out of mind that it could re-occur in Europe – with the notable exception of Bosnia in the 1990s. And if that was not enough, Russian officials have made not so subtle statements about the possible use of tactical nuclear weapons in Ukraine. The unthinkable is not so impossible.

UN Special Envoy for Mid-East Peace, Tor Wennesland, refrained from blaming Israel for the recent violence on the Temple Mount, when videos showed Palestinian rioters throwing rocks, setting fireworks and using barricades of refuse in the mosque. Meanwhile, what the U.S. and others find completely unacceptable, is that some Jews want to pray out loud on the Temple Mount in violation of the centuries old ban on Jewish worship there. That ban is officially labeled "status quo".

This is my last message to you for my term in office. I have tried to keep these letters relevant to Jewish concerns, our Congregation's needs and have sometimes indulged my own sense of whimsy to convey my messages. It has been an honor to be president of our shul. I look forward to supporting our next president that you will choose next month at our Annual Meeting.


