June's President's Message

Friends,

As I take over as President of our Congregation, I wish to express my sincere gratitude to our outgoing President, Harris Honickman, for all his hard work these past three years. These have been extremely trying times for society in general, and for our Congregation in particular, and Harris deserves much credit for helping to steer us through them. COVID has forced us into new modes of operation – first canceling services, then holding services outside, and finally over the last year, with the advent of vaccines and air filters (courtesy of the Farash Foundation), returning to indoor services. But still our kiddishim, holiday parties, and other shul activities remain suspended, and masking and other precautions remain in place. The light at the end of the tunnel is perhaps starting to flicker on, but still we must remain cautious and respond according to the best advice of medical authorities.

The disruption of COVID has led us to rethink ways to preserve the vitality of our Congregation, and one new innovation has been the Shabbat Morning Service sign-up sheet. I urge you all to make use of this method to encourage participation in our services. By signing up, to let us know you will be coming to services, you help encourage others to join as well. If you have misplaced the link for this sign-up sheet, please contact me and I will be happy to send it to you. If you have trouble accessing the sheet, just send me an email and I will add your name to the weekly list. If you have not been a regular participant in our Shabbat Services, now would be a good time to give it a try!

Going forward, our Congregation faces many challenges, not just those brought about by COVID. Membership is declining and our building is aging. We will need to find new ways to navigate these issues that may involve departures from "business as usual." I ask you all for your cooperation, your suggestions and feedback, but most of all your participation. We have a core of dedicated individuals who take upon themselves the task of keeping things running. But help is needed to keep that core from getting exhausted! I want to express my great appreciation to all of you who volunteer to serve as officers, as trustees, or who regularly participate in services.

With the start of this month of June we will have the second of the three annual pilgrimage festivals, the holiday of Shavuot, marking the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. As in past years, our Shavuot services will be held in conjunction with Temples Beth Am and Beth David. We will begin with Erev Shavuot service on Saturday evening, June 4, at 9 pm. The service will be hosted by Beth Am, in the Beth David Sanctuary (TBK room 200), to be followed by a Torah Study session.
