November's President's Message

Friends,

The holidays are finally over! With the small shul collaborative we had minyans for all but one evening service on Sukkot, Shmini Atzeret, and Simchat Torah. Thanks to all who participated and helped to organize and lead the services.

Our new sukkah went up quickly, and came down almost as quickly! Shaped like a box kite, it tried to take off on one windy day, to be found later resting on its sechach. We had to take down the walls as a precaution against flying away again. Next year we will use weights to hold it down.

We now enter the month of Cheshvan, which in Talmudic sources is called Marcheshvan. The usual interpretation is that "mar" means "bitter," and Cheshvan is bitter because there are no Jewish holidays in it. Unfortunately, this Cheshvan may turn out bitter for a number of other reasons. This Cheshvan will be the month for elections! We start with the run-off election in Brazil on Sunday (Oct 30). Voters will choose between current right-wing President Jair Bolsonaro and left-wing former President "Lula" da Silva. At stake may be the future of the Amazon rain forest. We follow with Israeli national elections on Tuesday, November 1. Vying for power will be a right-wing coalition of the Likud, Religious Zionists, and Orthodox parties led by Netanyahu, vs the anyone-but-Netanyahu coalition consisting of the centrist Yesh Atid party of current prime minister Lapid, leftist Labor and Meretz, right of center Yisrael Beiteinu, and new centrist National Unity party led by former IDF chiefs Gantz and Eizenkot, and former Likudnik Sa'ar. The Arab parties, which ran on a united list two elections back, then fractured into two lists for the last election, has now fragmented into three separate lists. Yet the race is so tight that the Arab vote might prove influential. This will be the fifth national election in the last three years, and it remains unclear whether it will produce a stable governing coalition or not. Finally, a week later on November 8, we will have our own US elections. Never, in recent times, has our country seemed more divided. Whatever your political viewpoint, I urge you most strongly to go and vote. Early voting in New York begins on Saturday, October 29. 




