

December's President's Message

Friends,

This month we again celebrate the holiday of Chanukah. We all know the traditional story about the evil King Antiochus, the hero Juddah Maccabee, and the miracle of the oil that lasted 8 days. For a more nuanced story you may refer to my message back in the Dec. 2018 issue of the Bulletin. Looking for something new to say this year, I happened upon this article by Benjamin Sommer of the Jewish Theological Seminary (https://www.jtsa.edu/torah/the-true-story-of-hanukkah/). It discusses the familiar Chanukah song *Mi Yemalleil*, contrasting the original Hebrew lyrics with the translated English lyrics. The Hebrew lyrics were written by Menashe Ravina, who emigrated from Ukraine to Palestine in 1924, where he became a music educator. The opening line of the song, *Mi yemalleil gevurot Yisra'el* (trans: *Who will describe the mighty deeds of Israel?*), is borrowed from Psalm 106:2, but with a secular twist; the Psalm reads, *Mi yemalleil gevurot Adonai* (trans: *Who will describe the mighty deeds of the L-rd?*). According to Sommer, the Hebrew lyrics were meant to reinforce the Zionist ideal that the people will redeem themselves, in contrast to the traditional view that only G-d will redeem the people; the latter perspective is more in tune with the English lyrics. It is an interesting article.

On a more down-to-earth note, after a two year absence, we are happy to announce that we will have an in-person Chanukah Party this year at BHBI, to be held jointly with Temple Beth Am. The party will be on Sunday, December 25, starting with candle lighting at 5 PM. Bring your own chanukiah and candles if you wish to light! Following songs and other fun activities we will have a light dinner of lentil soup and latkes at 6 PM. Reservations are <u>required</u> by Monday, December 19, 5 PM by email to BHBIRochester@gmail.com. The cost will be \$10/adult, \$5/child 12 or under, \$25/family maximum. You may pay at the door. Please note that we continue to follow covid restrictions, which means everyone must be masked unless eating. To keep social distancing, we regrettably restrict the party to members and close family only. Small children must be properly supervised.

BHBI continues to practice Covid restrictions. All participants at services must be vaccinated and masked. If you test positive for Covid after attending a service, please let us know by emailing to BHBIRochester@gmail.com. We will keep your identity confidential, but we wish to let others who were at the service know, so they can test if they are concerned.




