May's President's Message

Friends,

It is that time of year again! BHBI will have its annual membership meeting on Sunday, May 7, 3:00 pm, inperson at BHBI. Please come to vote in (or out!) our Officers and Trustees for the coming year, to approve our annual budget, and to make your views known! We need a quorum of 25% of the voting-eligible members to conduct business, so please make every effort to attend. If you cannot attend, you may send your proxy for someone attending the meeting to vote on your behalf; but proxies do not count towards the quorum. Each attending member can cast up to two proxies. I hope to see you at the meeting!

On Thursday May 25th we begin the Holiday of Shavuot with a Shavuot Dinner at BHBI, at 6:00 pm. Shavuot is the holiday on which, according to tradition, G-d gave the Israelites the Torah and blintzes. Our dairy dinner (not necessarily blintzes) will be followed by an evening service at 7:30 pm, which will be followed by a study session, topic to be determined. Our holiday services will be conducted jointly with Temple Beth Am, so please see the calendar on page 2 for times and locations.

Israel update: As reported in my last two messages, the situation in Israel remains turbulent. As I write, the Knesset is on a holiday break, set to begin its summer session on April 30. Negotiations between the governing coalition and the opposition parties have been ongoing, though it is unclear if any progress has been made. Members of the governing coalition appear intent on pushing their judicial overhaul, while hundreds of thousands of Israelis continue to protest at mass rallies each week. For up-to-date information, I recommend to you the <u>Times of Israel</u>.


