

January's President's Message

Friends,

We had a very nice Chanukah Party last month! The latkes were fresh (out of the box) and the lentil soup was delish. Many thanks to Paula Bobb and Judith Mercer, who helped in the kitchen, and Ami Schmerl, Esther Vogelstein, and Leon Metlay, who helped set up.

This month we celebrate the holiday of Tu B'Shvat, the New Year for Trees. "Tu" stands for the Hebrew letters tet and vav, which together have the numerical value of 9 + 6 = 15, as the holiday occurs on the 15th of Shvat. But the date of this holiday gives an example of one of the disputes between the school of Hillel and the school of Shammai. It is Hillel who ruled the holiday should be on the 15th of Shvat, while Shammai claimed it should be on the 1st of Shvat. The source of the dispute had to do with determining the time that trees start to live off the water of the new year, as opposed to the water of the previous year. It was accepted (don't ask me why) that the new water takes effect four months after the period of judgement for water. Because the Mishnah states that the world is judged with regard to water on the festival of Sukkot (15th of Tishrei), Hillel concluded that the start of the new water, and hence the new year for trees, should be 4 months later, on the 15th of Shvat. Shammai claimed that since the entire world is judged on Rosh Hashanah (1st Tishrei), and that judgement must include a potential judgement about the upcoming water of the new year, that the new water should take effect four months later on the 1st of Shvat. Hillel argued that the actual judgement of water on Sukkot took priority over the potential judgement of water on Rosh Hashanah. As with other disputes, the Rabbis decided in favor of Hillel. 
