This month we start our introduction to the Yamim Noraim (High Holy Days) with a Selichot service on Sunday morning, September 29, 9:00am at BHBI. The service will be followed by a movie (TBA). We will also be publishing our annual BHBI Yizkor Book, for use during the yearly Yizkor Memorial Services, starting with Yom Kippur. The High Holy Days will begin with Erev Rosh Hashanah on Wednesday evening, October 2 at 6:30pm. Once again our services will be led by Dr. George Kornfeld. As most of you already know, earlier this year the Congregation made the difficult but necessary decision to sell our building on East Avenue, where we have been situated since 1964. The maintenance needs of the building have become more than our small congregation can sustain. We are currently engaged with a buyer, and if all goes well we hope to complete the sale around the end of the secular year. We are currently negotiating to move to rented space elsewhere, where we will continue to hold independent weekly Shabbat services. Consequently, this year's High Holy Day services will be our last in our present building. I hope you will all come so that we can have a fitting turnout for this sad but historic occasion.




