December's President's Message

Friends,

With December, winter has officially arrived, and with it the cold weather (*grrrr*....). But with winter also comes Chanukah! This year our annual BHBI Chanukah party will take place on Sunday, December 29, 5pm at BHBI. This year also marks the 150th anniversary of the founding in 1874 of Congregation Beth Israel, one of the precursors of today's BHBI. BHBI is thus descended from the second oldest synagogue in town (the oldest being TBK). Therefore, we have a double reason to celebrate! This will also be our last party in our current building, so I do hope to see you all there! See page 3 of this bulletin for further information, in particular for the registration deadline for the party.

We all know the story of Chanukah, how the Maccabees led a rebellion against the evil King Antiochus, who had banned various core Jewish practices. Less well appreciated is how the Maccabean revolt was just as much a civil war against the Hellenizing Jews of Judea, who sought greater assimilation into the Greek cultural milieu. The Maccabees were jealous to reassert the authority of traditional Jewish practice and obedience to G-d's laws. The willingness of the Maccabees to die for their religious beliefs later went on to inspire the Zealots (*kana'im*) of the 1st century, who incited the rebellion against Roman rule. As we know, that did not work out quite as well. Zealotry, it seems, must always be tempered by a large measure of realism and caution.

The sale of our building is proceeding apace. The City has now approved the rezoning of our building from a single family residence to a multiple family residence, a necessary step in our buyer's plan to convert the building to apartments. Further approvals by the City Historic Preservation Board will be needed, but hopefully these will be obtained. Many of our older siddurim, chumashim, and machzorim were buried at the Community geniza held at Temple B'rith Kodesh at the end of last October, and other books and unneeded ritual objects will be buried at Britton Road Cemetery when we finally leave the building. Some of our larger objects of furniture, such as two wooden desks and our piano, have gone on to new loving homes. But there are many other items, large and small, that remain available, so if anything catches your fancy, please let me know. It is difficult to predict the exact date when we will cease to hold services in our building, as much depends on our buyer and the exercise of his contingencies in the sale agreement, but my best prediction at present is February. Negotiations are ongoing for our move to a new location. I will update you as the situation clarifies.


