#### February's President's Message

Friends,

The big move is finally upon us. We have now signed a lease with Temple Beth El to rent space in their building as our new home. Our new sanctuary will be in the former "pastoral counseling room" on the ground floor, right next to the elevator (entrance via the parking lot). Our space for office and kiddish will be in a former classroom in the school wing. We have been welcomed warmly by the Beth El community, who have been flexible and accommodating to our requests. I wish to thank all the Officers and Trustees of BHBI who have worked for over a year to help make this difficult and emotional transition go as smoothly as possible. I thank our membership for their understanding and commitment.

I also sincerely thank all those who have helped to sort though our varied belongings, the accumulation of 150 years of our Congregation's long history (Beth Israel was founded in 1874), and then help to adopt, repurpose, or suitably dispose of those items that we will not be taking with us. I wish, in particular, to thank Harris Honickman, Frank Weiner, our caretaker Lual and his friend Thomas, for helping me in the strenuous task of dismounting our memorial boards from the wall. These boards will be reinstalled in Temple Beth El, in space near the Beth El chapel. Let us hope for a continued warm and beneficial relationship among our community's Conservative congregations, as we now share a common building, and as BHBI begins the latest chapter in its long story.

The schedule for our move is as follows. Saturday, February 1, will be our last Shabbat morning service in our building on East Avenue. The title of this week's parsha is "Bo", which in Hebrew means "Come." I hope you will all come to this special occasion and bid farewell to the building that has been our home for the last 60 years. The service will be followed by a special farewell luncheon, sponsored by Dave Rogachefsky. On Sunday, we will meet at the building to pack up our books and other portable belongings. On Tuesday morning the movers will come to transport our furnishings over to Beth El. If all goes well with the move, and we get our new spaces set up in time, we will have our first Shabbat service in the Beth El building on Saturday, February 8. I hope to see you there!
