June's President's Message

Friends,

I'd like to thank you all for electing me President of BHBI. Many thanks to Steve Teitel who guided us through the chaos of selling our building and the success of moving into our new rooms at Temple Beth El. Thanks to the many people who helped along the way. Many thanks to the other officers and Board members who have chosen to continue their service to our shul.

When Steve reminded me that one of my duties as President is the monthly president's message in the Bulletin, he suggested I could just copy and reuse my messages from the past. I did look back at some of my previous messages. This is how the message of June 2016 began:

"Another year has passed, we've had our annual congregational meeting, and you've re-elected me President of BHBI. This has a feel of "same old, same old." Our shul is pretty stable both financially and physically and it's easy to get into the habit of thinking that we can just keep drifting along. Our landscape has changed. Two years ago, we were the only small Conservative shul in our area. Temple Beth El is nearby, but clearly distinct from us in size and atmosphere. A year ago Temple Beth Am left Henrietta, and recently Temple Beth David left Irondequoit. Now, all of the Conservative synagogues in Rochester are within walking distance of each other. We are no longer so distinct."

Now, 9 years later, all the Conservative shuls are under the same roof. The system we had of small shul collaboration is a thing of the past. We've done pretty well over the last 4 months, getting minyans most of the time, sometimes with help from Beth El members. But, we should not get complacent. Every week is a challenge of "can we do it again?" Every holiday is a challenge of "do we do this ourselves or do we go to Beth El?" We need all of you to come and bring your friends, the same plea I made 9 years ago.

The month starts with Shavuot. We will be joining Temple Beth El for study on the first night and for morning services. We will be having our own Shavuot dinner on the second night. More information is on page 2 of this Bulletin. I look forward to seeing you there.
