Friends,

We really have made it a haimishe place. There is an on-line signup sheet where you can tell us which services you are coming to (you can get the link from Steve), but you don't have to sign up in advance to come, it just helps us plan. If you want to try out your Torah or Haftarah reading skills, there is another on-line signup sheet for doing readings. If your new year's resolution includes learning to read Hebrew or learning to chant Torah or Haftarah, please talk to Esther Vogelstein or to me and we would love to help you.

Our first-ever Miniature Golf outing was postponed last month, because of weather. It has been rescheduled for Sunday, September 7, at 3:00 pm, at Whispering Pines. I hope I'll see you there.

It is also worth noting that we have just passed the 20th anniversary of our BHBIRochester.org web page. Steve Teitel has kept it running and kept it up to date. When you see Steve, thank him.
