February's President's Message

Friends,

I'm writing this during the last week of January. Next month will mark a whole year in our new space at Temple Beth El. With this cold weather, I've realized there are two more things I don't miss about our building on East Avenue: shoveling snow off the steps, and worrying about pipes freezing. If you miss the old building, apartments there are supposed to be available by April 1st, \$3300 per month for 2 bedrooms. (Thank you Esther Vogelstein for the information.) Meanwhile, we have renewed our lease for the coming year with Temple Beth El.

This past year has been one of adapting to new situations and I would like to thank all of you who have helped make this a good year. We have arranged our new rooms, so that they feel homey. People have been coming to services more than they used to, so that we have had minyans a majority of Shabbats, only rarely needing to recruit visitors from upstairs. I look forward to seeing all of you during the coming year.

We have a "new year" coming up February 1-2, Tu Bishvat, the new year of trees. In the land of Israel, all the agricultural produce needed to be tithed, and Tu Bishvat was established as the cut-off date for deciding which season produce belonged to. We should try to eat some of the "seven species", fruits specifically mentioned as coming from the land of Israel: wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives, and dates. Some people treat Tu Bishvat as a day to think about repairing the environment.

Thinking farther ahead, Purim is coming the first week of March. We will have our own services again this year. There are several chapters available if you want to sign up to read a chapter. If you don't want to chant it, you don't have to. If you do want to chant it but don't know the music, I'd be happy to help you. I hope you are staying warm. Have a good month, and I'll see you in shul.
